All: Your loving presence here in our midst is a sign of our constant goodness and mercy be with us Lord, during our moment of sorrows and

loneliness. You are our rock, our fortress and our strength. We lift up to you our grief and sorrow, confident that you will change our mourning to rejoicing that our beloved brother/sister _____, now rest in peace in paradise, singing praises forever to you, our God.

LEADER: Father, we thank you for all the blessings you gave him/her in this life. In your mercy and love, forgive whatever sins he/she may have committed through human weakness. Now that he/she has passed from this life; may he/she live in your presence forever, praising you with all the Angels and Saints in heaven. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.
